Public-Private Partnerships on Water and Sanitation Issues in Small Towns: Case of Mvurwi, Zimbabwe

Abstract

The study examined the role of public–private partnerships in solving water and sanitation issues affecting Mvurwi town. A total of 144 questionnaires were administered to respondents across Suwoguru, Rusununguko Phase 2, and Pembi View. Purposive sampling was employed to select key participants such as the Town Secretary, and Community Services Clerk. The Statistical Package for Social Sciences Version 20.0 software was used to analyse data. Findings indicate that 66% of the respondents are directly affected by water and sanitation issues. Fifty percent of the respondents agree that public–private partnerships are essential in rehabilitating the water and sanitations.
